From Ash Wednesday to Easter: "Be Still"

Next Wednesday, **March 9**, we observe Ash Wednesday. Mark this day as a special time to begin the spiritual pilgrimage to Easter. Attend Ash Wednesday worship 6:45 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. Join your church family for Soup Supper at 6:00 p.m., worship with Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes, and stay for the beginning of a six week Lenten study on Psalms of Peace.

Our theme this Lent is "Be Still." In Psalm 46:10, God says: "Be still, and know that I am God!" We will take the words and spirit of this command seriously and reflect on the spiritual gifts of stillness and peace. Ash Wednesday, we are still as we hear God's forgiveness and are reminded of our God's love in the midst of our mortality. March 16 we enjoy the stillness and peace of a Taize service of meditation through song. March 23 we sing songs of meditation. March 30 we let God's healing come to us. April 6 we observe stations of prayer. And April 13 we find stillness and peace through guided imagery.

Lent is the 40 days, not including Sundays, before Easter. The church throughout the ages has devoted this time to considering the life of Jesus, his acts of healing, teaching, caring, being the prophet, and prayer. Lent concludes with Holy Week as we recall Jesus even giving his life for our sake and the sake of all in the world.

Just as Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness facing the demons that wished to assault his soul by making food, power or money into gods, so Jesus invites us to face the temptations and habits in our own life that keep us from the Peace and Joy that God wishes for all people.

May God's Spirit of Peace surround you in your Lenten disciplines of prayer, study, fasting, a changed habit, and regular worship.

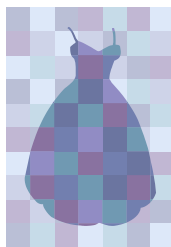

Jauvalda Francique is 3 years old and eager to go to school—especially since the school she’ll be going to is brand new and her parents helped build it.

The school building in Jauvalda’s home town of Léogâne in Haiti was nearly destroyed in the January 2010 earthquake. With help from ELCA Disaster Response, a new school building has risen from the rubble, designed to withstand earthquakes, floods and hurricanes. To help students feel safe within its sturdy walls, families were invited to participate in the planning meetings and were kept informed throughout the construction of their new school.

Parents were hired to help with construction. Children chose the colors. School families asked that the shutters be painted with words in Creole, French, English and even Finnish, a nod to the construction manager. Natural ventilation and plenty of light make the new school a cheerful, comfortable and safe place for children to learn.

Josette Jean Pierre, age 11, is delighted to be studying again. She says, “I’m happy to be back at school.” Her little neighbor Jauvalda can’t wait to get started herself.

Answers to: Why Does Lent Begin So Late This Year?

Thanks to the Peters family and the confirmation class for submitting answers to the questions I asked in the last newsletter! Only one question seemed to trip them up.

- 1) Sundays in Epiphany 2011: The longest possible: Nine, including this coming Sunday, Transfiguration Sunday
- 2) Transfiguration is the last Sunday in Epiphany
- 3) Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent.
- 4) Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox.
- 5) Easter 2011 is April 24.
- 6) There are six Sundays in Lent including Palm Sunday.
- 7) Palm Sunday is also called Passion Sunday.
- 8) Thursday of Holy Week is "Maundy" ("Commandment" to love one another) Thursday.



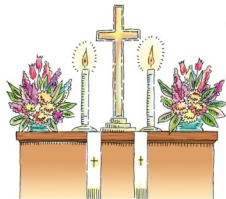
